City Manager's Remarks

Nature Preserve: We were informed that the Army Corp of Engineers will be signing our Nationwide permit very soon giving us authority to complete the driveway off of Route 57. As the property is still owned by Morton Salt, Matt S. and I have been communicating and working with Morton to finalize our purchase agreement. Our deadline to proceed with the completion of the Nature Preserve is June 30, 2022 as we were given an extension on the final phase of the project by OPWC. The WJR ribbon cutting ceremony preparations are being managed by Garrick and his staff. We will give Council adequate notice of this ceremony as your presence would be greatly appreciated.

The WJR Nature Preserve is now part of the Wayne County Winter Hike Challenge sponsored by Local Roots Market & Café. We will have this information available on the WJR Nature Preserve Facebook page, our website as well as copies of the brochure at the Rec Center. What a fun way to get fit and be out in nature during the winter months!

Solar Panel Project: If you have been out by our Waste Water Treatment Plant, you will see all the work that has been done on the solar panel project. The installation of the panels continues and we are hopeful that this work will be completed this spring. Mike Brown has been doing a great job working with the Verde Solutions representatives as questions and concerns arise.

BWC updates: Matt and I met with our TPA (Third Party Administrator) Mark Milano who assists us with our BWC options for discounts and to also go over our claims' history over the last several years. The city has done very well, in regards to claims and lost time due to accidents, which is a testament to our staff. Matt and I will continue assessing BWC programs and grant opportunities as they arise.

<u>Legislation</u>: I will ask Council to consider this evening adopting Ordinance 8275 which will allow the city to accept the 2022 Energized Community grant and also Resolution 8276 which will allow the city to apply for a revolving loan for our water line replacement project of Sterling, Erie and Walnut Streets, as a requirement of the Ohio EPA who administers this loan.

THANK YOU! Another storm and more great work by our plow crew, police and fire. It was quite a snow event and everyone did an amazing job so even though words aren't enough, we truly appreciate their hard work and dedication to the citizenry of Rittman.

Finance Director's Remarks

First, I'd like to address that at some point in the near future we are going to be moving away from Payment Service Network or PSN which is who we use to process our online payment options as well as our physical credit card swipes at the Rec Center. We will be moving to a new company for those services called PAYA. We don't have an exact timeline as of yet for that transition. Any residents who had accounts set up with PSN will have to make a new account through PAYA to continue paying that way. It shouldn't be a harsh process but it's a thing that we will have to do. We would like to push for more residents to use the recurring ACH Payments through us directly. The reason for that is the online services charge for each transaction. ACH is completely free. Currently there are less than 15% of residents using this option. We would like to promote this option so more residents utilize it. Second, I'd like to discuss the format of our annual financial report going

forward. Currently we contract with Rea and Associates to help construct an Annual Certified Financial Report or ACFR. This report ticks all the boxes we need with the State and for audit purposes for our annual report. Theirs also goes above and beyond that, it's much, much longer. It fulfils the requirements to submit the report but the Governmental Compliance Officers Association will get a certificate. Which is really nice to have but it is also costs the City much more than basic financial statements would be to put together. My proposal is starting next year for the 2022 report, my proposal is to drop down to basic financial statements. It's going to save the city around \$5,500.00 to \$6,500.00 per year. That is my proposal, but nothing has been done yet. I just wanted everyone to be aware. Carey inquired if this would have any negative impact on obtaining grants? Bubp responded no. And lastly, is our CIVICA CMI software for our finance department to function. It is also used currently for utility billing. We are on a client server version of the software which the city has been using for at least 24 years. It hasn't had any major updates in that time. Support for it is ending in July of 2023. We are going to have to do something. I just wanted there to be an awareness of this. That is going to be a big process.

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RITTMAN, WAYNE AND MEDINA COUNTIES AND STATE OF OHIO, DECLARING IT NECESSARY TO IMPROVE EASTERN ROAD FROM GISH ROAD TO RUFENER STREET BY PLANING AND MILLING THE EXISTING SURFACE, AND INSTALLING A NEW ASPHALT SURFACE, ALL TOGETHER WITH THE NECESSARY APPURTENANCES THERETO AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the City of Rittman, Counties of Wayne and Medina and State of Ohio, two-thirds of all members elected and appointed thereto concurring:

SECTION ONE.

That it is declared necessary to improve Eastern Road from Gish Road to Rufener Street.

SECTION TWO.

That the plans, specifications, profiles and estimate of cost of the improvement prepared by the City's Service Director/City Engineer and on file in the office of the Clerk of Council are approved. The improvement shall be made in accordance with the plans, specifications and profiles for the improvement.

SECTION THREE.

That this Council finds and determines that (I) the improvement is conductive to the public health, convenience and welfare of this City and the inhabitants thereof and (II) the lots and lands to be assessed as described in Section Four hereof are specially benefited by the improvement.

SECTION FOUR.

That the City shall assume and pay as its local share of the cost of the improvement fifty percent (50%) of the cost and the remainder fifty percent (50%) shall be paid by the residents based upon the lineal foot.

SECTION FIVE.

That the cost of the improvement shall include the cost of preliminary and other surveys, plans, specifications, profiles and estimates and other surveys, plans specifications, profiles and estimates and of printing, serving and publishing notices, resolutions and ordinances, the amount of any damages resulting from the improvement and the interest thereon, the cost incurred in connection with the preparation, levy and collection of the special assessments, the cost of purchasing, appropriating and otherwise acquiring any real estate or interest therein required for the improvement, expenses of legal services including obtaining approving legal opinions, costs of labor and material, and interest on bonds and notes which may be issued in anticipation of the levy and collection of the special assessments, together with all other necessary expenditures.

SECTION SIX.

That the City's Service Director/City Engineer is authorized and directed to prepare and file in the office of the Clerk of Council the estimated special assessments of the costs of the improvement described in this Resolution. Those estimated Special assessments shall be based upon the estimate of cost of the improvement now on file in the office of the Clerk of Council and shall be prepared pursuant to the to the provisions of this Resolution. When the estimated special assessments have been so filed, the Clerk of Council shall cause notice of the adoption of this Resolution and the filing of the estimated special

assessments to be served in the manner provided by law and the owners of all lots and the lands to be assessed.

SECTION SEVEN.

That special assessments to be levied shall be paid in five (5) annual installments, with interest on the principal amount of each special assessment at the same rate as shall be borne by the bounds or notes to be issued in anticipation of the collection of the total of the unpaid special assessments, or the prevailing interest rate upon notes if no bonds or notes are issued; provided, that the owner of any property assessed may pay the special assessment in cash within thirty (30) days after passage of the assessing ordinance.

SECTION EIGHT.

That bonds of the City may be issued in anticipation of the collection in annual installments of the special assessments, and notes of the City may be issued in anticipation of the issuance of those bonds and levy of the special assessments. The remainder of the entire cost of the improvement, after application of the special assessments, may be paid by the issuance of bonds in the manner provided by law or from other funds available for that purpose.

SECTION NINE.

That this Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meeting open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION TEN.

That this Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety in said City, and for further reason that this Resolution
